

Challenges


- Not sacrificing resident wellbeing & comfort through incompatible safety measures
- <u>Recognize</u>: Neighbourhoods form the "spokes" of any community's "wheel"
- Safety = prevention first, remediation second
- Safety is the responsibility of all stakeholders (participants, staff, visitors)
- Mission: Re-examination of the area's Designation, Definition, & Design of built environment

CRIME PREVENTION THROUGH ENVIRONMENTAL DESIGN (C.P.T.E.D.)

<u>Defined as</u> :

"The proper design and effective use of the built environment, leading to a reduction in the fear and incidence of crime and disorder. This in turn leads to an improvement in the overall quality of life of a building, space or area."

SOCIAL DISORDER

OACP – Community Safety & Crime Prevention Committee

<u>Defined as</u> :

"Social Disorder" – The state or condition whereby the behaviour and events within a specific place or situation lack tangible control or order, compared to what is reasonable. This often leads to a perceived lack of safety and an growing loss of a community's social well-being and vitality. When this occurs, the requirement for outside assistance and resolution from agencies such as emergency services (e.g., Police, EMS, Fire) and other social and human service providers often increases dramatically.

Social Life of Small Urban Spaces

Study developed by William Whyte in 1980 of New York's plazas Studied why some public spaces "work" while others do not – using observation & interviews Small urban spaces are "priceless" within the realm of our streets (urban "rivers of life") Whyte observed/photographed/spoke to users to understand dynamics of human usage of space Good design facilitates positive civic engagement





Primary Findings

Significant amount of Vacant Property <u>l</u>. - A Catalyst for Problems 2. Loitering/Vandalism/Graffiti/Debris are sources of neighbourhood blight **Small & Inconsistent Address** 3. Numbering Insufficient/ Poorly Applied Lighting Lack of Positive Activity Generation 5.

Facts & Fundamentals to Consider

- 1. Safety dictates comfort level
- 2. Vacant Property = magnet for problems
- 3. Positive Activity Generation = safety
- 4. "Self Policing" sustains neighbourhoods
- 5. Promoting positive behaviour deters establishment of negative behaviour




Get to Know Your Neighbours
